

ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

Credit is awarded to those students who take Advanced Placement (AP) courses at the high school level and score a 3 or higher on the examination administered by the Educational Testing Service. Students seeking AP credit should request a score report from The College Board be sent to the Office of the Registrar, Cumberland College.

Music Theory AP must take two tests, one written and one oral, and receive at least an 80% on each part to receive credit for Theory I, MUSC 131. The student must set up an appointment with the Theory Professor prior to the beginning of the Fall semester each year in order to take these tests. Transfer students must also pass the Theory placement exams prior to beginning their current level of Theory. The Theory Professor will assess the results of these exams. If the student does not receive at least an 80% on each part of the tests, they will receive credit for Music Appreciation, MUSC 130 and must take all of Theory I, MUSC 131.
