1. PRESIDENT'S CABINET

3. ACADEMIC STANDING

4. ACCEPTANCE AND SCHOLARSHIP

7. CATALOG AND CURRICULUM

Responsibilities: The committee reviews, adopts, or recommends all curriculum changes for the university. The committee's responsibility extends to any policy with regard to program admission, graduation, programs, and courses. The committee also has the responsibility for how these items are exhibited in the college catalog.

Composition: The Vice President for Academic Affairs (Chair), the Registrar (Secretary), the Associate Dean, the Library Director, and the Teaching Certification Officer serve as permanent members. Six departmental chairs serve two years at a time on a rotating basis. The rotation is determined by the alphabetical order of academic departments. Three department chairs rotate off each year and are replaced by three other department chairs.

8. COLLOQUIUM

9. COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES

Responsibilities: The committee selects the members of all other standing committees of the university. Each year the committee removes all committee members who have resigned or retired and assigns all current faculty members to at least one committee. The committee surveys faculty during the spring semester to determine where faculty members' committee interests lie. If possible the committee then honors each faculty member's request when it produces a new standing committee list for the fall semester.

10. COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE HARASSMENT ISSUES

Responsibilities: The committee hears any issue of harassment relative to the university. This includes not only sexual harassment but any form of harassment or discrimination. Once a complaint has been lodged with any member, the committee will investigate the incident and determine the accuracy of the charge. The committee may in some cases resolve the issue. In those cases where resolution is not possible, the committee will inform the administration and make a recommendation within thirty days of the complaint.

Composition: The committee must be composed of faculty and staff. The Committee on Committees appoints the faculty and staff members.

The committee also suggests speakers and programs for convocation. The committee makes recommendations for exempting students from convocation to the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Composition: The Director of Church Relations and Convocation serves as Chair of the committee and the Dean of Student Life and the Director of Campus Ministries serve as permanent members. The Committee on Committees appoints the other faculty members of the committee. The Student Government Association appoints a student to the committee.

13. ETHICS IN HUMAN RESEARCH

14. FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

Responsibilities: The committee monitors the maintenance of all campus facilities, recommends priorities in the maintenance, improvement, and development of the university's facilities and equipment to ensure adequate support for the university's programs, and recommends space allocation of facilities. The committee reports its findings annually to the Vice President for Operations and the Long-Range Planning Committee.

Composition: The Vice President for Academic Affairs (Co-Chair), the Vice President for Operations (Co-Chair), the Vice President for Business Services, the Dean of Student Life, the Director of the Physical Plant, and the Athletic Director serve as permanent members. The Committee on Committees selects a staff representative and faculty members. Two faculty members serve a two-year term with the Committee on Committees selecting a faculty member each year to replace the faculty member rotating off the committee. The Student Government Association appoints a student representative.

15. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

Responsibilities: The committee formulates policy and reviews all requests involving funding that continues the academic growth and development of faculty members and recommends the approval or non-approval of the requests to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. All projects and requests will be measured by the relationship of the project to the development of the individual, the department, the university at large, and the Mission Statement of the University of the Columbians. The committee is also responsible for developing programs which will enhance the growth and development of the faculty as a whole.

35. TECHNOLOGY USE
